Heather (Link Governor and Chair of the School Improvement Group) will also be in the hall to discuss her role and take your views on school at present and how things can be improved further in the future.

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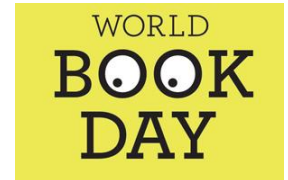


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## World Book Day – Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March 2019.
