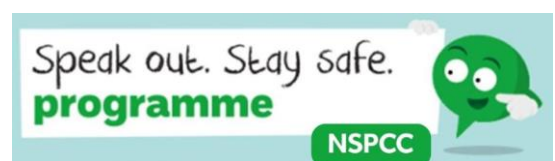
Rowling Class:
