## School meals

The cost of producing schools meals is due to rise in September. We are working with County Caterers to ensure that we can continue to provide children with healthy meals using fresh produce from local suppliers in the most efficient way possible. Unfortunately, the school does not have the resources to subsidise this increase and it will therefore be necessary to increase the charge for a school meal with effect from September 2019. The cost of a meal will rise from £2.35 to £2.50 for all three primary schools in The Ryedale Federation. The cost of a nursery meal will increase from £1.85 to £2.00.
